

BUS PASSES

IMPORTANT: This year again bus passes will only be given for students travelling to a place for childcare. The office will not be tracking bus passes for multiple days from the office this year. Therefore, we would ask if a note be sent each day if they require a note. For ongoing scenarios where the child goes to one place multiple days a week and a different location the other days we will accept a monthly calendar to prevent writing bus passes. A copy will be given to the driver and teacher, and one kept at the office. When a student goes to the farm every Monday all year, then we request a note every Monday. TEXT MESSAGING SYSTEM

Parents are invited to join our emergency text messaging system. The system is configured to send text messages to mobile phone numbers whose recipients have agreed to receive them. We use text messages to communicate during emergency situations as well as specific school closures or early dismissals.

When a new number is added, you may see the following message:
