have our Welcome Kindergarten night on May 10th by appointment. We look forward to meeting all of our new students as we have some fun stations planned.




Here are this month's literacy tips:

- -Also, Easter is another great time to bake with your child or something with your child. Following instructions/recipes is a very strong literacy skill!


Mr. C's Book of the Month


